OUR COMMUNITY

Roosevelt is a diverse suburban community with approximately 16,900 residents. It is a hamlet in the Town of Hempstead, and is located on the south shore of Long Island, about 30 miles east of New York City, and is 1.8 square miles in size.

SCHOOL PROFILE

Roosevelt High School is a four year comprehensive public school, accredited by the Middle States Association of Secondary Schools and the New York State Board of Regents. Approximately 3,950 students attend Roosevelt Public School in grades kindergarten through 12. There are three schools serving students in grades K-6, one middle school serving students in grades 7 and 8, and one high school serving students in grades 9-12. The high school population totals 1035 (including 250 seniors), and students are provided with Regents curriculum that enable them to successfully transition into post-secondary schools and meet the demands of colleges and universities.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Our student population is 100% minority and is categorized into the following: 38% Black/African American, 61% Hispanic/Latino Population, and 1% Other. 75% of our students are economically disadvantaged and receive Free or Reduced Lunch.

CURRICULUM

Students are required to fulfill a minimum of 22 credits for graduation. These credits must include: four units in English, four units in social studies, three units in mathematics, three units in science, one unit in world language, one unit in fine arts (art or music), one-half unit of health, two credits in physical education, and additional electives (as needed). Advanced Placement courses are offered to students in grades ten through twelve.

CLASS RANK

Roosevelt High School does not rank students by cumulative grade point averages (GPA's). However, student transcripts do reflect weighted and unweighted averages for the purpose of distinguishing between rigorous courses offered (Regents, College, and Advanced Placement).

COLLEGE AND ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

Scholars Academy courses are multiplied by 1.1 when computing a student's weighted GPA, and Advanced Placement courses are multiplied by 1.2.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Students who enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses must demonstrate academic success in previous courses and be recommended by their teacher. AP courses receive a weight of 1.2 in the GPA calculation. In total, 102 students wrote 157 Advanced Placement examinations during the 2021-2022 school year in the following areas:

In the 2020-2021 school year, we had a total of 10 AP Scholars, including 1 AP Scholar with Honor and 7 AP Seminar and Research Certificates.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAM

A range of clubs and activities are available after school, and approximately 30% of our students participate in interscholastic sports. We offer 19 Varsity and 11 Junior Varsity teams, as well as the opportunity for students to explore and develop their athletic talents. Since 1964, we had several Long Island, Division, Conference, Finalist, and County Championships.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- ~ Nassau BOCES Barry Tech - A vocational program for upperclassmen (grades 11 and 12); we also offer an on-site simulated emergency room, as well as certified programs in Nursing, Culinary, and Medical Assisting.
- ~ Special Education - Students with special needs are provided with individualized programs to support their success.
- ~ Scholars Academy -Early College High School program offered to students in grades 9-12, in partnership with SUNY Old Westbury.
- ~ English as a New Language (ENL) - Students who are native speakers of other languages are provided with programs designed to help integrate them into the English academic mainstream.
